If you are looking for an article, you can identify them easily by looking for this icon:



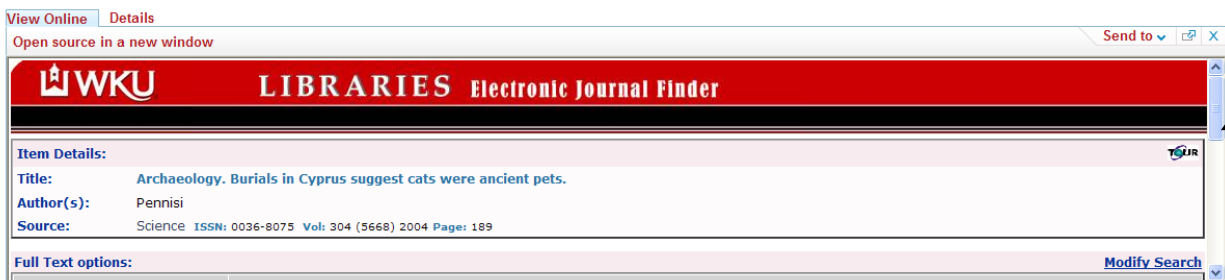
To see if the journal results you get have the article attached you are looking for the phrase “**Full Text Available.**”

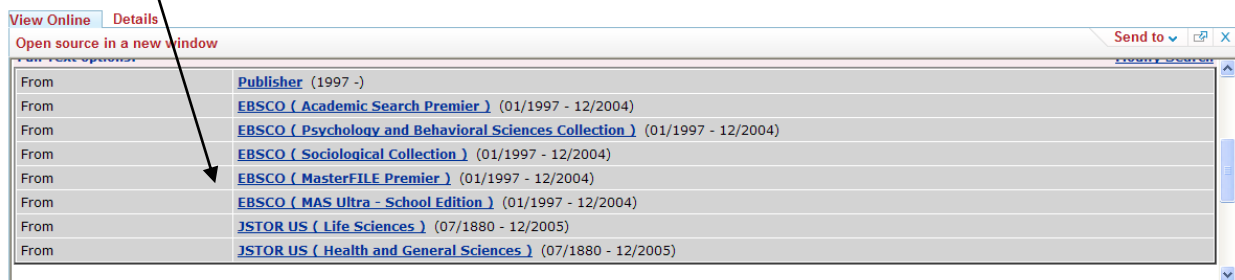
